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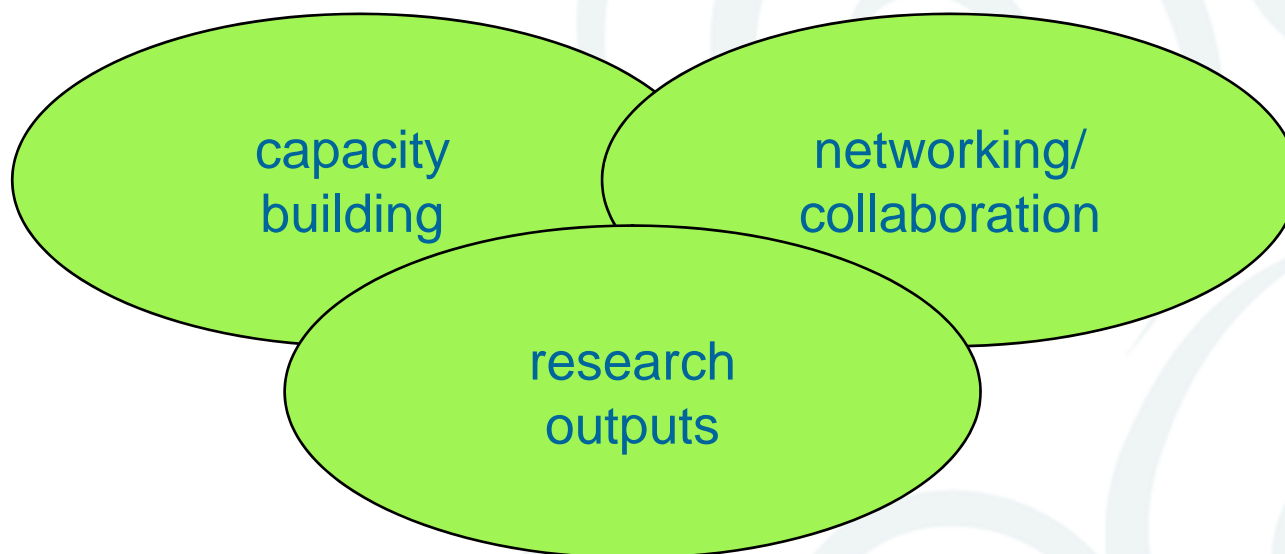

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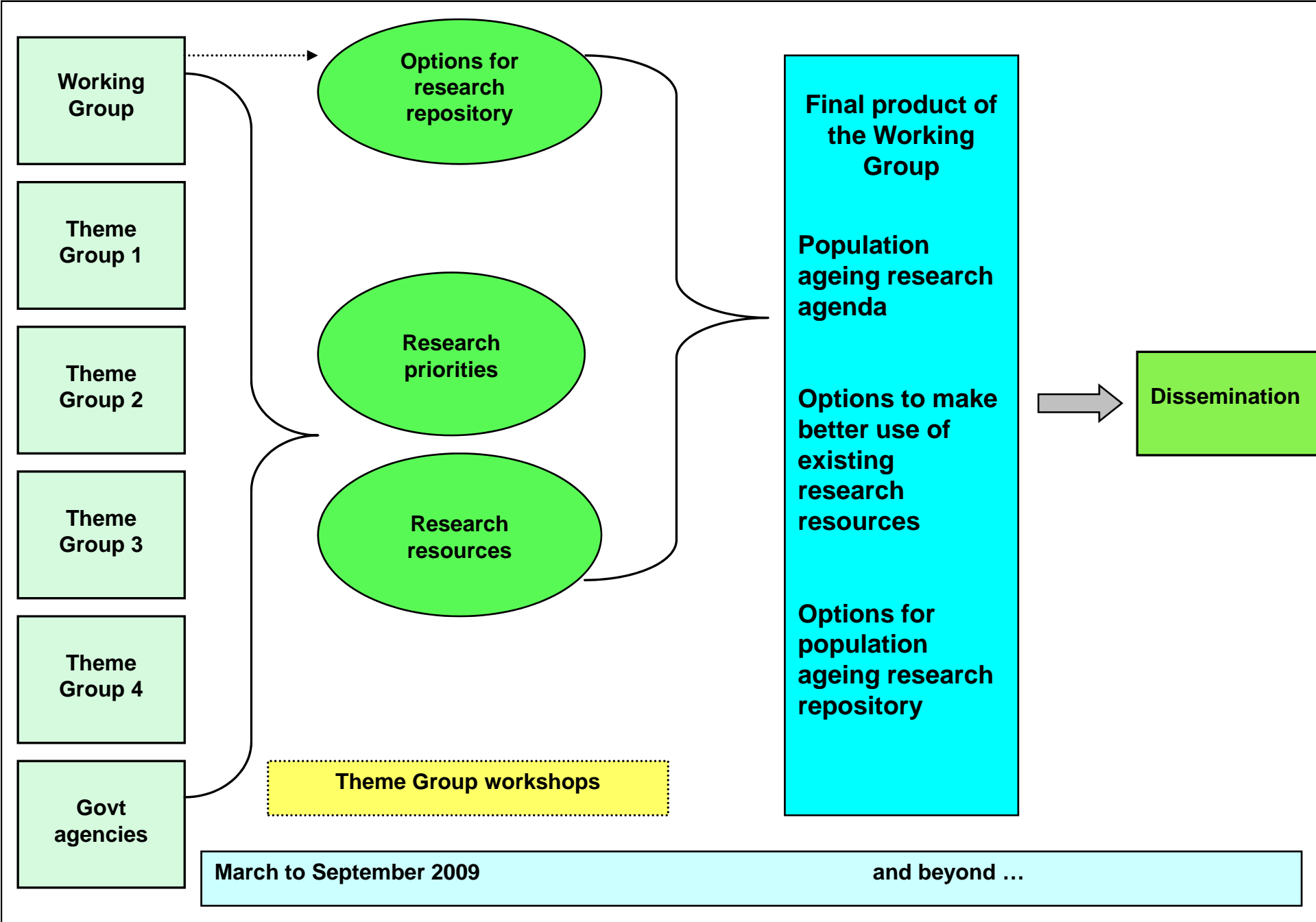

evaluation criteria

A IS THERE RESEARCH AVAILABLE

- 3 – NZ has specific knowledge needs and very little is being done anywhere that we know of
- 2 – International research has been completed, or underway, but may not address all of NZs specific needs
- 1 – International or NZ research completed, underway or planned

B GOVERNMENT NEEDS TO KNOW

- 3 – significant issue for NZ and government urgently needs to know this to assist with decision making
- 2 – significant issue for NZ and government needs to know in medium term to assist with decision making
- 1 – either not significant OR not urgent

C USEFUL FOR SECTOR

- 3 – very useful for many organisations/agencies working in the sector
- 2 – very useful for some organisations/agencies working in the sector
- 1 – either not as useful OR only very useful for a few

D PRACTICALITY IN TODAY'S CONTEXT

- 3 – able to be undertaken within existing research resources (including expertise)
- 2 – able to be undertaken with minimal addition to existing research resources
- 1 – would require significant additional research resources

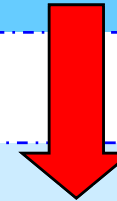
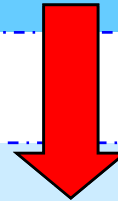
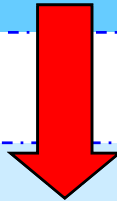

- use existing information, datasets
- be mindful of quality of life – the goal is to improve/maintain wellbeing
